«Hope does not disappoint us»

From Saturday, May 17 to Sunday, May 18, four Faith and Light communities in Korea came together for a retreat. A total of 91 people participated, including Father Maximilian, chaplain of Light of the Orient province; Father Cho Byung-hwan, chaplain of the Cheongju Dandelion community; and Father Ahn Hyo-seok, chaplain of the Mokpo Lighthouse community.



The theme of the retreat, “Hope does not disappoint us” (Romans 5:5), was beautifully in line with the Jubilee theme, “Pilgrims of Hope.”

Each year, the four communities in Korea gather for one united activity, which varies from year to year - sometimes a pilgrimage, sometimes a cultural event or trip, and at other times a retreat. This year was a retreat year, and we met at a retreat center nestled in Jirisan, the largest and most beautiful mountain in the south of Korea. Surrounded by the freshness of early summer and the gentle sound of water flowing through deep valleys, we spent two days sharing love, friendship, and the Word of God - truly a time of joy and renewal.

The first day began with a welcome Mass, followed by fellowship, praise, and a lecture by Father Cho Byung-hwan.



After dinner, everyone gathered to pray the Rosary to the Blessed Mother. At the beginning of each decade, members from each community performed a mime depicting the life of Jesus.

During each Hail Mary, roses were offered with devotion, and all communities joined in this act of love and prayer. The next day began with morning prayer, followed by songs of praise, a lecture by Father Ahn Hyo-seok, and small group sharing where participants reflected on their experiences during the retreat. As a sign of unity, we also enjoyed a creative activity: colouring the Faith and Light logo together.

Although the time was short, through the two inspiring talks we were reminded that this is the Jubilee Year, and we were invited to reflect more deeply on its spirit. We gained new strength and hope to live as confident children of God, without losing faith even in difficult circumstances. Meeting friends from other communities renewed our sense of solidarity and friendship.



We left refreshed, our hearts strengthened and encouraged, ready to return to our daily lives with renewed hope. ●

the Spirit of Faith and Light resulting from our Charter and Constitution.



“He has done great things for us”

The pilgrimage of the 49 Italian communities, gathered to celebrate 50 years of Faith and Light in Italy, took place from September 18 to 21, 2025, at the Shrine of the Virgin of the Rosary in Pompeii, near Naples.


A total of 520 pilgrims from the three provinces of Fiume di Pace (River of Peace), Kimata and Mari e Vulcani (Seas and Volcanoes), as well as delegations from Croatia and Slovenia, and friends of the Kimata province from Greece, Cyprus and Albania, celebrated 50 years of friendship and spiritual growth.

Our theme was “He has done great things for us”, and each day was inspired by the Magnificat. For Mariangela Bertolini, the “mother” of Faith and Light in Italy, this canticle of Mary was the beginning of a journey in the face of the great fragility of her daughter Maria Francesca, known as Chicca, but also the foundation of numerous communities, in Rome and in various regions.

The Italian history of Faith and Light began with another pilgrimage to Rome for the 1975 Jubilee. A video was shown, summarizing the milestones experienced over the past fifty years: the first steps in Italy after Lourdes in 1971; the journey towards national unification; the creation of the three provinces in 2009 into which the Italian territory is organized; and the work of the national Association “Faith and Light Italy”.


There are so many moments to keep in one's heart: a young girl with a disability, Antonella, dancing the Magnificat during the mime (in her eyes, we see the infinite sweetness of God's embrace); the net with the names of communities past and present, carried to the stage by people with disabilities, their relatives and friends; the prayer vigil with the mime in the form of shadow puppets in the Sanctuary of Pompeii, meditating on "the Mysteries of Faith and Light." (*)

At Faith and Light, you feel at home, you feel joy, you feel welcomed, as evidenced by the joyful exchanges in the hotels, the messages entrusted by everyone and the enthusiasm of our young presenters Marta, Angelo and Nicolò.

Sister Veronica Donatello, head of the Italian Bishops' Conference's National Service for the Pastoral Care of People with Disabilities, shared this reflection with us: *"Only 25% of families of people with disabilities have friends. You are champions of friendship. You have to show your charisma to everyone. For you, people with disabilities are not people to be assisted, but people with whom to share a journey of faith. You have the gift of calling out to Christian communities, parishes and dioceses. Be like a bell announcing: We can't exclude anyone from the Lord's table; let's learn to become a community!"* Invite everyone to the table of life. Step out of your contexts, don't be afraid: there's a people of fragile people waiting. Be the leaven that mixes with the new flour, have courage."



Report in Italy



Raúl Izquierdo, our international Coordinator, was present with his wife Laura, and he told us how he discovered Faith and Light at the age of 18: "Over the years, I have discovered a God who loves the smallest, a God fashioned in the mud of humanity. Faith and Light has helped me to grow up in simplicity and helps me to keep a childlike heart, teaching me to be more aware of my weakness, but also of my abilities. God continues to use Faith and Light to remind us that he loves people beyond their merits and abilities."

At the final Mass, **Father Benoît Malvaux**, national spiritual assistant for Faith and Light, summed up what had emerged from the four days: the Magnificat was like a guiding thread, reminding us of the importance of the smallest in God's eyes. Mary accompanies us in our trust in God, who has sustained us through so many trials, and in our friends. Many parents have felt chosen by God when a child with disabilities was born. Mary, too, was chosen and guided along a path she could never have imagined. We entrust ourselves to her when we no longer know what is the best decision to make. To her, a strong yet discreet presence in our lives, we entrust our future.

Here are a few testimonials from participants: "Many people came from far and wide to celebrate an important anniversary; it's like being at home, because you feel good and happy," testifies Daniela, from the Rho community (Milan). "Franco, from San Giovanni Battista in Bari, adds: "It was a wonderful experience, well worth the effort.



And Angela, from Rome, concludes: "We hope that Faith and Light will live on for another 50 years, or even more, because we're very strong!"

Then the young participants: "We return full of hope, full of joy and rich in friendship. Let us sing the Magnificat again, for the Lord has done great things for us and through us." ●

the Lord's promise: "*Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest.*"

From Marseille to Rome...

In spite of some logistical concerns, I had been looking forward to this jubilee pilgrimage to Rome for a long time. I was delighted to be able to register, because I enjoy these pilgrimages organised by the Diocese of Marseille: Lourdes, the Holy Land, Jordan... Each time, I experience something special that is good for my inner life and my faith.

But then, why live it with Faith and Light? I am not a member of a community, but sharing a summer camp with them has become familiar to me. I appreciate the joy we share there and, above all, the great simplicity of our relationships. This is one of the traits that people with disabilities teach us. In their presence, we learn to simplify our relationships, to make them more direct, without pretence or calculation. And that is so restful! This simplicity in relationships is also found in their faith, in their way of praying and giving thanks. For example, they do not complain.

In their prayers, they are much less demanding than we, their companions, who have greater physical and intellectual capacities. It's surprising, isn't it? We were all pilgrims of Hope, but deep down, these friends showed me that hope is lived in the



present: in the smiles they wear today, alive and happy in the friendship of Christ. Everything else can come later. Isn't that the Hope we wanted to rediscover by going to Rome?

The diocesan events were a little complicated for us because our group, which was a bit slow-moving, almost always arrived late. But I will always remember the diocesan Masses at St. John Lateran and St. Peter's in Rome.

Thank you to Monsignor Aveline and the pilgrimage service team for allowing us to share such experiences together! ●

I had the privilege of travelling with the Faith and Light group on a pilgrimage to Rome: I was given a 4:45 am meeting time for a coach trip departing from Marseille. I quickly forgot about the early start and my concerns about travelling with a group of strangers. Whether they were companions like me or people with disabilities, everyone showed me their joy and greeted me with big smiles. I quickly realised that their differences made them unique and extraordinary individuals.

We set off for Rome, 16 coaches leaving from Marseille, all recognisable by our yellow scarves, for a jubilee pilgrimage on the theme of Hope.

From the outset, I knew that this pilgrimage would not be a quiet retreat, but rather a joyful hubbub at times: between finding luggage, broken lifts and the cobblestones of Rome, I discovered the virtue of patience alongside them. And yet, amid the difficulties, and there were many, a sense of peace reigned. A glance, a smile, a burst of laughter... and everything was fine again.

Five days to discover artistic masterpieces and learn more about the lives of saints and Christians who came before us. We were called to reaffirm our faith, celebrate the love of our God, and embark on a journey of conversion.

First Mass at the Gesù Bambino sanctuary in Arenzano, during which the preacher suggested four graces to ask for on this pilgrimage: the grace of goodness, the grace of freedom (to be more ourselves), the grace of living in brotherhood (to realise that Christ came to save all men) and an individual grace.

Passing through the four holy doors, visiting and attending Mass in the basilicas, and praying before the tomb of Pope Francis filled me with wonder, but what touched me most was experiencing it all together with the whole group, united as one.

The general audience with Pope Leo XIV and the papal blessing remain a very powerful moment: God makes himself present in a unique way in human frailty. I thought I was coming to 'accompany' others, but it was the members of the Faith and Light group who guided me to our Lord through their trust, their patience, their indestructible joy, their sincerity, their simplicity, their embodied faith. They are so rich in love.

I give thanks for my encounter with the Faith and Light group: a human and divine adventure. By going to Rome, I rediscovered the Gospel lived out in daily

life thanks to and with my new friends. ●

I am on the Faith and Light coach. Some of us have known each other for a long time. We are one big family, brought together for this wonderful adventure to the Eternal City.

It was a long journey, but it was filled with songs, prayers and lots of laughter (good humour was always guaranteed) with our driver Patrice, who was always attentive to everyone's needs.

On Wednesday, there was a papal audience in St Peter's Square. Once again, we had difficulties with our bus, which couldn't start because of a problem with the doors opening. Finally, we arrived at St Peter's Square well behind schedule and tried to make our way to the area that had been allocated to us. It was very difficult. Despite the rain, our hearts were happy to be in the midst of this huge crowd welcoming the Holy Father. When we finally arrived near our seats, which were all occupied, our leader Sophie and Emmanuel, a future deacon, found someone from the Holy See who opened a barrier for us. We were propelled towards the platform closest to the Pope.



It was an emotional moment when someone asked us not to move because the Pope was coming to greet us. I was stunned and couldn't believe what we were experiencing. What a surprise for us.

To our great surprise, but with immense joy, the Pope came to meet us and stayed with each of us for a moment. When he reached me, I was overcome with emotion. I couldn't believe my eyes and my heart was stirred by the sight of the Pope, our shepherd, our earthly father. I genuflected, then the Holy Father took my hands and we looked at each other for a moment (an interminable moment, with no noise around me, time suspended). I managed to tell him that I was praying for him.

The Lord has helped me and supported me many times in my life. He has saved me from many pitfalls and torments, and again on Wednesday, 22 October, He told me of His love and that I was His beloved daughter. I give thanks to God for this jubilee year. ●

The Night of the Witnesses

Every year, Aid to the Church in Need (ACN) organises an event in France called 'La Nuit des Témoins' (The Night of Witnesses). ACN is a Catholic aid organisation founded in 1947 to help war refugees. Recognised since 2011 as a Pontifical Foundation, it serves Christians around the world through information, prayer and action wherever they are persecuted, oppressed or in material need. It is present in 23 countries.

I regularly attend this always very moving evening, and the testimonies of those who come to talk about the situation in their countries touch me deeply because I know that in the countries where the witnesses come from, there are often Faith and Light communities. Last year, I even had the pleasant surprise of meeting Monsignor Samson Shukardin, former chaplain of the community in Pakistan.

I also know that in every country where Christians are persecuted, there are families with disabled children, and for them, it is a double punishment. In all these countries, Christian organisations come to the aid of these families. In the Middle East, in particular, organisations such as ACN and Oeuvre d'Orient provide assistance to centres that help people with disabilities.

During this year's celebration, which took place in Notre-Dame Cathedral in Paris, I also had the pleasant surprise of hearing a song, "Venez, les bénis de mon Père!" (Come, blessed ones of my Father!), composed by Grégoire François-Dainville, Chief executive officer of the Jérôme Lejeune Foundation, another well-known Faith and Light organisation! I still remember the lecture that Professor Jérôme Lejeune gave in Lourdes at Easter 1991 on the occasion of the twentieth anniversary of Faith and Light; his unforgettable voice still resonates within me. In this song, where we can hear both "You, the little ones and beloved of God" and 'You who are excluded and all those who are killed', I understand that the persecuted of our world form a single and, unfortunately, too large family...

It is important to establish good contacts with all those who work tirelessly to help Christians under threat in so many countries around the world; the members of our communities will benefit from this. In addition to the three organisations I have already mentioned, we can also mention – for France – the MEP (Paris Foreign Missions Society) and Fidesco (The Emmanuel Community).

Christmas message from Don Marco Bove

The angel came to her and said,
“Hail, full of grace,
the Lord is with you.”
(Lk 1:28)

The Christmas message still has the power to surprise us. In the angel's words to the Virgin Mary, we find above all an invitation to joy, “rejoice”, much more than a simple greeting. We always have many reasons to worry and be sad, to withdraw into ourselves and not see the signs of hope and flashes of beauty around us.

However, the angel invites Mary and all of us to joy, which is not a simple emotion, but a mission. That is why he reveals to her, and to us, the reasons for this joy, the secret of all authentic joy. What is this secret? The angel reveals to her that she has been touched and filled with God's grace, that is, with his gratuitous love, with his tender gaze, which is why Mary is full of grace. God's love always precedes and surprises us.

The angel also reveals to her that because of this love, God himself gives himself in communion, “the Lord is with you”, which is why she will never be alone, but will always be able to count on his presence.

The sign of this love and communion will be the child who will be born, Jesus, who will indeed be called ‘Emmanuel’, God with us.

For us too, knowing that we are loved and recognising God's presence at our side is a source of joy and great confidence. It takes away our feelings of loneliness and abandonment and gives us the certainty that our lives are precious in his eyes.

That is why joy becomes a task, because it must be shared. By offering our love and closeness to those who feel alone, we can make the joy of Christmas our own and pass it on to others.

This is the gift and mission of each one of us and of our Faith and Light communities, so that the joy offered to us may reach everyone and become a sign of closeness and communion for the most fragile and isolated.

May the joy of Christmas accompany us beyond these holidays and may God's closeness enable us to experience authentic communion.

My name is **Antoinette Makhoul Akoury**, and I have been involved with Faith and Light in Lebanon since 1980. I am a physiotherapist working with elderly





Five fish and two loaves

We often face deadlocked situations. But for the Lord, there are no dead ends. Anything is possible, provided he finds men and women who trust him and are willing to give, like the young boy in the Gospel, their five loaves and two fish so that Jesus can perform the multiplication of the loaves.

This is somewhat the 'holy' story of Faith and Light. Two severely disabled children; parents who were saddened that they could not enrol them in a pilgrimage; a team with limited resources who committed themselves to helping them—this is how the first international Faith and Light pilgrimage came about. From this pilgrimage sprang communities on every continent that simply want to show parents and everyone around them that their child with disabilities is precious in the eyes of God.

They have their place in society and in the Church, where they are called to be honoured as one of the weakest members of the Body.

The Lord has done wonders for us. He continues to lift up the humble, to fill the hungry, to extend his mercy to all who trust in him. But his love urges us to go further, to reach out to other parents in solitude, to call on friends who are able to understand and commit themselves. To reveal the treasure hidden in our wounded brothers and sisters. To create around them and with them places where they can grow humanly and spiritually...

We have few resources, we are small. But our hope is great because we have already experienced how much God loves us and how powerful his grace is. ●
