# Called and sent as Peter

International meeting and general assembly, Strasbourg 2023

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### Welcome to Strasbourg!

50 people from 54 countries met in Strasbourg from 4 to 12 July for the international meeting and general assembly held every five years, this year in a very warm and beautiful place: Le Centre Culturel Saint Thomas. 49 of the fifty-one provinces were represented. Unfortunately, nine people were unable to obtain their visas: three from Egypt, one from Kuwait, one from the Central African Republic, one from Rwanda, one from the Democratic Republic of Congo, one from the Dominican Republic and one from Syria.

The theme of the meeting, "Called and sent as Peter", was repeated each day: "Come follow me" (the call), "Master, we are sinking" (fear), "Go out into the deep and cast your nets" (trust), "The least among you is the greatest" (the temptation of power), "You are the Messiah" (profession of faith), "You must wash one another's feet" (service), "He lives and he lived" (witnesses to the resurrection), "Feed my sheep" (mission). Each day, a beautiful watercolour by Silvija Knezekyte, from Lithuania (provincial coordinator of Between the Seas), illustrated the theme of the day.

It was a wonderful meeting, despite Ibtesam's accident and having to be repatriated to Jordan, plane delays, lost suitcases that were soon found... We were delighted to welcome two friends for a few days who came to present L'Arche: John Sargent and Virginie Kieninger, and Pierre Pauchet who came to present the OCH Foundation.

Everything was remarkably well organised by a "sparkling team" made up of members of the Strasbourg community and of other provinces in France, who invited us to a big, beautiful party on the last day. Thank you to everyone for your welcome and your incredible vitality.

The meeting began with the general assembly, at which the 2023-2028 priorities for the movement as a whole were adopted, the board of directors was renewed and Raul Izquierdo and Maria-Silvia de Jesus Tavares were re-elected as international coordinators for a second five-year term.

We experienced everything that Faith and Light communities lived around the world: deepening, celebrations and feasts. In the morning, there were alternating round-table discussions, followed by time for sharing in small groups and various workshops.

One of the nice surprises was a visit from our founder, Marie-Hélène Mathieu. Many thanks to her for joining us!

## Reports from the president and the international coordinator

oda and Raúl each presented their reports. Two similar points emerged: the revelations about Jean Vanier's actions were like a bombshell within Faith and Light, and the Covid pandemic affected the whole world. These two events had a profound effect on their mandate. In five years, the Board of Directors has only been able to meet once face-to-face in Trosly (France) and once with the international coordinating team in Salamanca (Spain).

Coordinating teams in these conditions is a real art. Many Zoom meetings were organised, but they were long and tiring. We had to be inventive and creative to maintain links despite the confinements. The provinces, the communities, sent in their accounts of everything they had invented during this period to maintain the links in their community or between the communities in a province. Then came the war in Ukraine. The 37 communities in the country organised themselves to maintain the unity and life of Faith and Light in the country. That's a lot of hardship for one mandate!

Even when the boat rocked, it didn't capsize and the captains didn't leave their posts, even when the temptation was there, they stayed.

Thank you, Hoda and Raúl, for these reports that were more than testimonies, they were almost confidences that gave hope and confidence to everyone.

#### Report from the treasurer



érard Chaurand has completed his second mandate as international treasurer. He reminds us that money is at the service of the mission of Faith and Light and that we are all responsible for the finances. After presenting the accounts, Gérard expressed concern about the declining number of communities and the inequality of contributions between provinces, with donations and subsidies coming only from France. Gérard had three wishes for the future: to continue the annual meetings of treasurers, to play an active role in the future of Faith and Light International and to create an international "donations and legacies" team.

"At the end of these ten years, I ask you to make your new treasurer happy and smiling for the harmony and development of Faith and Light. Think about it and all act for it!"

#### **Priorities 2023-2028**

aria-Silvia presented the proposals for the 2023-2028 priorities drawn up after consultation with the provinces. The following proposals were adopted by the General Meeting:

- 1. Develop new ways to promote Faith and Light
  - By highlighting Faith and Light's community and spiritual life in a way that responds to the contemporary cultural needs of each country.
  - By using all means available (technological, creative, and cultural).
  - By reworking Faith and Light documents to be accessible and up to date (except the Charter).
- 2. Encourage the growth of all the members of the movement in shared responsibility at all levels.
  - By finding and preparing people to assume leadership roles.
  - By providing tools for formation and training.



#### 4. Elaborate a durable strategic, economic, and financial plan

- By conceiving of and putting in practice strategies to find funds at every level.
- By increasing the revenue of the movement by having all the provinces contribute
- By continuing the work of collaboration between the international and provincial treasurers.

#### 5. Implement the code of conduct in every country

- By adapting it to the laws of every country (ecclesiastical and civil).
- By making sure every member knows the code and is involved in the prevention and the reporting of abuse.
- By promoting the well-being of all members of the community, particularly the most vulnerable.

Before arriving at this text, the questions and a great deal of attention.

## Conferences and round tables

#### "Where do we come from? Where are we going?"

he first teaching of the week is given in a highly original way. Daddy Faith (Raúl) and Mummy Light (Maria-Silvia), who have been married for 52 years, sit side by side and reminisce about their lives. In the old days we had plenty, we had everything. Today we have to deal with a shortage of young people, resources, leaders... We used to be young and beautiful, but now we've grown old. Religion used to be rooted in our culture; today it's indifference or even hostility. In the past, the family model was clear.

We have moved from a paternalistic view of people with disabilities to a more holistic view that takes account of their real needs and abilities. Once isolated, today's families are visible and better integrated into society and the Church. We have moved from a French model to an international dimension.

But we are more essential than ever. Faith and Light is an antidote to loneliness. It gives meaning to life with people with disabilities. It transforms suffering into resurrection, hope and joy.

- "Darling, I've been thinking about plastic surgery to look better."
- "No, don't. I love you the way you are, even if you have grey hair, I love you. Even if you have wrinkles, I love you."

Faced with this ageing, we might be tempted to be something different so that more people will join us, love us. But we don't. What is essential is Jesus at the heart of our communities and people with intellectual disabilities.



It was great to hear from representatives of L'Arche and to see friends with disabilities who live at L'Arche in Strasbourg. We were able to meet a father who brought his daughter with disabilities to the meeting for several days, and who lives in L'Arche in Strasbourg. He was really interested in how we live out our faith in Croatia, and it just so happened that he was in my group during the washing of the feet... It's not easy to express the connection that happens during foot washing and prayer. Our hearts are touched in this vulnerability and connection as brothers and sisters of the same Father. This is perhaps the best image of the whole Strasbourg meeting. What will remain is the sincerity with which Raul spoke of the past mandate and the way he dealt with the news of Jean's actions and the difficult period of Covid - a vulnerability that is allowed when we trust in God and in those with whom we share, when there is support.

#### Round table on ecumenism

Christian Albecker, President of the Union des Eglises Protestantes d'Alsace et de Lorraine, Father Jean-Georges Boeglin, diocesan delegate for ecumenism and canon of the Catholic Church, and Christine Durand, member of the Orthodox Church, will be sitting round the table, moderated by Antoine-Marie Izoard, journalist and head of the Ile de France Ouest province. Our three guests are all involved in "grassroots ecumenism" at the heart of their churches. The most important thing is to meet and get to know each other. When we meet and exchange ideas, prejudices fall away. You have to learn from other traditions. You learn to deepen your own faith through contact with others. We recall that ecumenism was born in the trenches of the First World War and in the concentration camps of the Second World War. People were trying to live together in solidarity. Ecumenism means learning about Christ from a Church other than one's own. Ecumenism can only be lived in a faith that loves. The more we allow the smallest person to be himself in the Church, the more we will understand Christ.

At the end, the congregation sang "Father, make us one".





## The mission of Faith and Light in Churches and societies

Don Marco reminds us that when Faith and Light was founded in the 1970s, it made a major contribution by announcing a new message that promoted the inclusion and participation of people with intellectual disabilities in the life of the Church and society. Today, Faith and Light's mission is still very important, even essential, because it no longer concerns the world of rights, but that of relationships and friendships. It is only the law of the heart and the teachings of Jesus that reveal to us that we are all brothers and sisters, each with his or her own gifts and fragility, with the need to love and be loved. Not only do people with an intellectual disability have the right to be welcomed in their church, but they are also called to be protagonists in the life of the church.

The delegates then split into small groups to reflect on these two questions:

- In the Church to which you belong, what steps have been taken and what closures still exist towards people with disabilities?
- In terms of sacramental life, what steps are still needed to receive the sacraments, to participate actively in the liturgy and in the life of the Christian community?





#### **Revitalising our communities**

The round table brought together a representative from each continent: Angela Grassi for Europe, Matanda Bakali for Africa, Gracy Tong for Asia, Gabriela Vasquez for South America and Andrew Dean for North America. Faith and Light is present on every continent, with similarities and differences for each country and culture.

The Covid period brought many difficulties. The strongest communities have been organised, the weakest have collapsed, and those that have managed have continued to struggle. How do we look to the future?

After each talk, a key word is chosen: Courage - Communication and inclusion - Unity and invitation - Rejection - Social networks and the media - Young people and witness - Creativity.







From the very first day, I felt love, a fraternal atmosphere, a feast of joy, regardless of the different languages and cultures, we are all in the same boat, rowing towards the same place, with storms, with calm, but the most beautiful thing is that we are all united in Christ and for our friends who are the heart of this unique and beautiful movement.

#### The coordinator's mission





This teaching was given by Elvira Gomero (Peru) and Urszula Czyrnecka (Poland). The Faith and Light leader serves with joy and humility in a climate of trust, peace and brotherly love. They plan, organise and lead activities. He sets priorities that will support the life of the provinces and communities. His community is his strength. He puts his gifts at the service of the mission. They are united with Jesus and the Gospel message. They recognise their points of growth, overcome their fears and ask for help. They show empathy for the people they accompany and maintain a personal relationship with them. It trains the future leaders who will take on new responsibilities. It engages in dialogue while respecting the ideas of others. It reinforces identity and mission. It sets objectives with the vision of Faith and Light for the next 5 years. It provides support in times of joy and in times of difficulty. To be responsible, you don't have to be wise or perfect, but you do have to be humble and know how to ask for help.

#### Presentation of the formation document

Following the General Assembly in Lebanon in July 2018, formation emerged as a priority for the coming term. The board of directors formed a project team to develop a formation plan to propose to the provinces. Joséphine Yamaki (Cyprus), Sophie Alexis (France), Tim and Maria-Cecilia Buckley (USA) and Father Toni (Mexico) met twice a month via Zoom from 2019 to 2021. Sophie and Maria-Silvia presented the booklet produced: "How to give life to our communities", intended for all members of Faith and Light and the various levels of responsibility: community coordinators and coordinating teams, vice-provincial coordinators, provincial coordinators.



## Time for discovery, to meet and share

#### Practical workshops and reflection workshops

Each day, practical workshops were offered: making the Faith and Light logo, songs, dances, candle painting... And reflection workshops: the spirituality of Faith and Light, the gift of friendship, the role of the vice-provincial coordinator...









In Strasbourg, I rediscovered my role as community chaplain and how it helps me to live out my priesthood. Every morning, I return to a prayer by Father Léonce de Grandmaison that begins with these words: "Mary, Mother of God, help me to keep a child's heart..." Meeting Marie-Hélène and hearing her testimony reminded me of this: sharing life with those who have never lost a child's heart also keeps it in us, the so-called 'normals' - even if we are continually tempted to be too adult and too reasonable.

## Vigils of prayer and celebrations

#### **Ecumenical celebration**

After the reading from Luke's Gospel about the calming of the storm and a time of meditation led by Andrew and Emilia Dean Quintana, interspersed with silence and song, all the chaplains present were called to the platform and then laid hands on the whole assembly to bless everyone. After singing "Father, make us one", we recited the Lord's Prayer in our own language.



#### Thanksgiving party

After the elections, a thanksgiving party was organised by Marie-France Violette (Mauritius), Endre Czany (Hungary) and Raúl. Three people with disabilities took it in turns to present a treasure chest.



The first box is opened and contains a piece of paper on which is written: "Thanks to life": thanks for family, children, parents and grandparents, people we have met, friends, work, studies, gifts... Then, in groups of five, we draw on a sheet of paper what we want to thank. With a beautiful Hungarian song, we will all bless and embrace each other.











In the second box, there is a piece of paper on which is written: "Thank you for my community". After the reading of Matthew's Gospel (11:25), "What you have hidden from the wise and learned", each person hangs a photo of their community with a clothes peg on the ropes stretched around the room. This sequence ends with a dance by delegates from Africa and the Indian Ocean.

Finally, the third chest was opened, on the paper it read: "Thank you for the international family of Faith and Light". A small card was given to each delegate, who had to write the word "thank you" on it in his or her own language and decorate it. These cards are then exchanged and taken home.







We were lucky enough to host the international meeting in the beautiful province of France Sparkling East, with over 150 participants from all over the world. It was a magical, enchanting moment. We were thrilled by the diversity of the movement. Discernment for the elections of the coordinator and the members of the board of directors was done with the breath of the Spirit. Each candidate was able to present his or her ideas to the provincial leaders grouped by province. Exchanges and meetings between participants enabled everyone to reflect on the future and to set the direction for the next 5 years. All this was done in a joyful and goodhumoured atmosphere, often with music. The morning prayer that led us to follow Saint Peter refocused on our work. The sharing groups gave us the opportunity to better understand the realities of the countries present. The meals were festive and delicious. The solidarity bar welcomed exhausted participants with open arms, but they suddenly regained their dynamism and vigour as they discovered the delicacy of Alsace wines and the bitterness of its beer. Well done to the community of "I'Amour de Dieu" in Strasbourg, who put all their energy (and that of their friends) into organising the event. #### Renewal of our call



This vigil, organised by Helena Escribano (Spain), begins with a reflection and meditation on responsibility in Faith and Light:

- Responsibility is based on God's love for us. Love is its purpose. Responsibility is the exercise of love.
- Responsibility is a path to perfection.
- Responsibility comes with a choice. God calls us, chooses us, but our response is also a choice, a renunciation, a gift of self.
- The Beatitudes of responsibility: Blessed is the one who serves in prayer, blessed is the one who serves in faith, blessed is the one who serves with humility, blessed is the one who serves with joy, blessed is the one who serves by accepting the cross and hoping for the light, blessed is the one who serves with the Holy Spirit, blessed is the one who serves by committing and giving the best of himself.

During this reading, several people hold up placards bearing the words: prayer, faith, humility, joy, acceptance, hope, Holy Spirit... Each person wears a white towel around their neck, reminiscent of the washing of the feet, as a sign of service. And we





go out in procession towards the garden. Outside, we are each given a small bamboo boat, a lighted candle and a small heart to hang from our towel. The procession can begin!



#### Washing of the feet

Divided into small sharing groups, we wash each other's feet after listening to the Gospel reading from John 1:13-17.







#### **Closing ceremony**



We've all dressed up in our national costumes for the occasion! It's an explosion of colour and diversity. We are about to be sent on mission by Don Marco and Raúl. It all begins with a reading and mime from the Gospel of Matthew 28:16: "Go and make disciples of all nations...".

Jesus called us to the mountain, and today that mountain is called Strasbourg! Don Marco calls the new council together. Raúl and Maria-Silvia draw a cross on each person's forehead and give them a small sheet of paper on which they can write and sign their agreement to follow Jesus wherever they are sent. In an atmosphere of silence and recollection, each international vice-coordinator gathers his delegates and repeats this gesture in turn. Then he calls Corinne and Céline and the nominating committee... The celebration ends with the Lord's Prayer and a grand farandole.









The general assembly was an excellent moment: joy, truth, transparency, friendship and discovery.
















## **Exceptional teams**
