The events of our General Assembly and International Meeting, which took place from 4 to 11 July in Strasbourg, France, are still very fresh in our minds. Under the motto "Called and sent like Peter", we gathered

around 130 people, including delegates from the provinces, members of the international team and board of directors, secretariat, nominating team, interpreters and logistics team of the Faith and Light community of Strasbourg. Some representing Faith and Light communities from all over the world.

The figure of Peter, the apostle and friend of Jesus, was the guiding thread of the meeting, in which we had time to share faith, formation and celebration. All this through prayers and liturgical celebrations,



talks and workshops, evenings and music. And above all, thanks to the work of so many people who did their bit, shared their skills and gifts, so that the responsibility was shared. We also had time and space to dream, review, plan and reflect on the present and future of Faith and Light. I trust that he will pour out his gifts so that those of us who have said "yes" to this call may carry out our mission with joy, wisdom and a spirit of service. I ask you also to pray for this intention.

Like Peter, we are called by Jesus to follow him. And once we are on our journey, like Peter, we experience the fear or temptation of power. And like Peter, Jesus tests us to renew our trust each day even in the midst of the storms, to keep asking the question: who is Jesus for me? And to remember that our call to serve must be in the style of Jesus himself as he did in the washing of his disciples' feet (which we also celebrate there). And finally, like Peter, witnessing to the Resurrection of Jesus himself that we cannot be left to ourselves alone
