And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased!" (Lk2:12-14)



Once again, we are touched by the announcement of the birth of Jesus by the angels to the shepherds on Christmas night. This announcement invites us to set out to meet the baby Jesus. It's not easy to find a newborn baby with so little information, just a sign: "a newborn baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger".

Let us ask the Lord Jesus, born among us, that our Faith and Light communities may be a sign of peace and reconciliation throughout the world, capable of acceptance and forgiveness.

May the Lord give us his peace, so that we too may be a sign of peace for all.
